








The Civitans have been operating a Farmers' Market in Oakville since 1979. The market traditionally opens in late April, but due to COVID-19 it was cancelled. Thankfully, that all changes on Saturday, July 4th. The Civitan Farmers' Market is located at Dorval Crossing East (Dorval Drive & North Service Road). The market operates on Saturdays from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM.

This year due to the need to maintain social distancing the market will have a designated entrance, and exit, with shoppers moving in the same direction. Shoppers will be asked to point to the things they would like to purchase. You can bring a reusable bag, but vendors will not touch them. People are encouraged to wear masks while in the market. We do still plan to hold one key fund raiser, our document shredding day, on Saturday October 3 at the Canadian Tire parking lot in Ancaster.


For the first time since its inception thirty years ago, the Alleycats Special Olympics Bowling League's season opening is being postponed until a later date.






