The opening ceremony with the business session is July 23rd at 7:00pm EDT. The Philanthropy Session with Dr Craig Powell from CIRC is Friday evening at the same time. Saturday, there will be an International Signature Service

Project during the day, details to be unveiled soon. Saturday evening at 7:00pm is the Celebration of Champions which will include the announcements regarding North American Awards, Honour Keys etc. Recognition of Governors and Governor Elects will happen that evening, as will the installation of President Elect Kelley, who will then address the membership on plans for the coming year.

I would encourage all who wish to participate in all or part of these events to register soon. Registration is limited as the Zoom license can only accommodate so many. I will be attending, as will Governor Elect Paul.

These are definitely strange times, which hopefully will be behind us before fall. Our Region 5 convention has been cancelled by the Northern Lights District who were to host this year. Your District Board has yet to figure out how we will be doing the "changing of the guard". Governor Elect Paul WILL take over the helm as of October 1st, and he still needs someone to step up and accept the position of Governor Elect for 2020-2021 as he is adamant that he will not stay in as Governor for two years. I will become Immediate Past Governor, and all other positions on the District Board appear to be remaining constant. We held a special District Board Meeting on May 9th to discuss changes moving forward with all the cancellations and will be holding another virtual special District Board Meeting on June 27th.

If anyone has a concern, they would like brought to the District Board, please contact your area director to request an audience. International is encouraging clubs to keep their club boards the same for a further year and have waived the annual training requirement that was instituted last year. **Continued next page**

Anyone who was trained last year does not need to repeat. Anyone who did not train last year is able to attend the online training starting in August (for which there is a cost) to become a certified club.





Dr. Matthew Alexander received a Research Award. Dr. Alexander is a CIRC researcher focusing on treatments for Duchenne muscular dystrophy.



Webmaster Updates

It's been a busy time for our District and Junior websites. From mobility to the Governor's calendar features we have become, or should become the focal point for all things District West. An example of this is statistically we went from 140 visitors per day in February 2010 to 657 in February 2020. For March we are already at 740 visitors and 4,124 pages viewed. This translates to visitors not only accessing the home page but a number of other pages on the site. Recently I added The Past Governor and District Honour key lists from our directory to the District site and these can be viewed via the More Links drop-down menu item.

As for the Junior website, I have been working with Tracy Beck and the past two Junior Governor's on a new design that is mobile friendly and I'm very happy to report that we are very close to going live. The new site should be active by the time you read this report.

Along with the above, I have created Governance Policies for both District and Junior websites which provides us with direction and ensures we review on a yearly basis. Up to this point, it has been my responsibility to ensure compliance and working with Lyle Armstrong to ensure the information is accurate and relevant. These Governance Policies bring other members into the mix and provides additional insight.

From the club perspective, many have a footprint via the District site and I ask that our Area Directors encourage clubs to have a website as their focal point if they currently do not. There is no additional cost to hosting club sites via our District site, therefore if clubs are paying for web hosting, they should be encouraged to contact me and look at either moving their site or recreating one under District.

THE REASON WHY AN ELECTION CANNOT TAKE PLACE THIS YEAR FOR THE TWO DIRECTOR POSITIONS ALONG WITH THE PRESIDENT-ELECT POSITION

Civitan International's bylaws directly convey that elections for these positions happen at an annual meeting of the membership, or what we call a convention. There is no verbiage in the bylaws to denote alternative means of voting at this time. In addition, bylaws that pertain to quorums and ones that define delegates (Sections 1.07, 1.09) could not be followed in a circumstance where an election was held outside a face to face meeting. For future reference, an adhoc committee is currently looking at the organization's bylaws. At the 2020 convention, they were set to propose some language changes that would allow for electronic elections of Civitan's officers but unfortunately that cannot happen until the Civitan International Board of Directors approves the proposal, and the membership at a convention ratifies that decision. With there being no in-person convention, that vote will not happen until 2021.

A virtual awards session/wrap up party will be held Tuesday, September 22nd for this event.

Civitan Fest transitions to Walk and Roll for Research

As much as we would love to play Plinko and giant Jenga on Zoom, carrying out a virtual Civitan Fest would be a bit tricky. This year, Civitan Fest will adapt in order to connect with membership and raise support for our flagship project. Save the date for August 31st – September 7th for Civitan Fest: Walk & Roll for Research! Playing on a former Junior Civitan event, Walk & Roll for Research will invite Civitans from across the world to select a day during this designated week (8/31-9/7) to sport their favorite Civitan gear and walk or ride for certain period of time. We encourage clubs to come together to form a team and execute this event on a club level. This would be a unique opportunity to invite potential members to join in the fun and learn more about your club.

CIVITAN INTERNATIONAL ELECTIONS PROCEDURE

Due to the decision by the Civitan International Board of Directors to cancel the in-person convention slated for Milwaukee in July, a procedure regarding annual International elections has been outlined, which adheres to the organization's governance documents.

The steps will be as follows:

- At the 2020 convention, elections for directors in Region 3 and Region 4 would have happened. Due to the cancellation of the convention, these directors will stay in place for the 2020-2021 year (as directed by Section 4.02 in the bylaws). This means International Director Tony Workman and International Director Carol Wolters will serve an additional year. Also, elections for these positions will be postponed until the membership gathers for the 2021 convention, and those elected at that point in Regions 3 and 4 would only serve a two-year term (2021-2023), to support the staggered term system in place.
- As far as the officers of the board, the organization's bylaws clearly communicate the President-Elect
 position is for one year only, and that person then moves to the President position once that year is
 up (as directed by Section 6.01 in the bylaws). This means for the 2020-2021 term, Immediate Past
 President Bob Jones will finish his service to the board, current President Patsy Perkal will step into
 the Immediate Past President role, and President-Elect Frank Kelley will become President.
- At the 2020 convention, the election for the 2020-2021 President-Elect would typically take place. Due to the cancellation of the convention, this election cannot happen outside such an event per our bylaws (Sections 1.05, 1.07, 1.08). This means the position of President Elect for the 2020-2021 year will remain vacant, until the next convention is held.
- · At the 2021 convention, elections for the following positions will occur:
 - o International Director, Region One (which was expected)
 - o International Director, Region Two (which was expected)
 - o International Director, Region Three
 - o International Director, Region Four
 - o International Director, Region Eight (which was expected)
 - o 2021-2022 International President
 - o 2021-2022 International President-Elect (which was expected)
- An International Policy will be developed to direct the election of the 2021-2022 International President, which will include different deadlines to qualify and an orientation schedule that will hopefully better prepare those candidates to serve immediately.
- Any bylaw revisions approved by the Civitan International Board cannot be ratified by membership
 outside a convention/annual meeting so that means the work currently being done by an adhoc
 committee will be presented before the 2021 convention.


Agincourt Civitan Club - #1870 Rhonda Thomson

OBITURAY FOR COMMON SENSE

Have you noticed the Mosquitos are already out!

Here is a homemade trap to help keep you and the kiddos from being a blood donor!!!

HOMEMADE MOSQUITO TRAP

Items needed: 1 cup of water 1/4 cup of brown sugar 1 gram of yeast 1 2-liter bottle

- 1. Cut the plastic bottle in half.
- Mix brown sugar with hot water. Let cool. When cold, pour in the bottom half of the bottle.
- Add the yeast. No need to mix. It creates carbon dioxide, which attracts mosquitoes.
- Place the funnel part, upside down, into the other half of the bottle, taping them together if desired.
- Wrap the bottle with something black, leaving the top uncovered, and place it outside in an area away from your normal gathering area. (Mosquitoes are also drawn to the color black.)

Change the solution every 2 weeks for continuous control.

5 things you need to know about June bugs



June bugs are a member of the beetle family, and beetles are survivors, despite the behaviour of the June bug.

It's June bug season. Here's what you need to know.

Nobody can figure out why they're hanging around your porch lights
Scientists have no explanation for the June bug's manic attraction to electric
lights. Late May and early June is mating season. The June bugs have just
weeks to reproduce. Then they die. You'd be frantic too.

June bugs spend most of their lives underground
The white, grub-like larva of the June bug lives in soil for up to three years.
They love nice green lawns, especially yours. Thousands of those grubs
are gnawing on the roots of your grass right now.

They have an extra set of wings, but they can't fly worth squat
These notoriously lame flyers actually have two sets of wings.
Only one of those pairs provides what scientists call lift.
Given their manic attraction to light (see Fact #1), June bugs quickly exhaust themselves. Then they collapse on your porch, belly up, for you to be freaked out by them.

That floundering June bug is somebody's dinner

June bugs that crash to the ground become an important source of food for
birds and mammals. That includes crows, blue jays, skunks and raccoons.

June bugs are beetles, and beetles rock

June bugs are members of the vast and diverse group of insects we call beetles. Beetles have been around 230 million years. One in four of all animals now living is a beetle.

When picking rhubarb, always grab it at the base of the stalk and give it a good tug and twist to pull it out by the root.

NEVER CUT RHUBARB!!!

The brains of the rhubarb plant are in the roots. When you pull the stalk out by the roots, the rhubarb feels it and says to


Itself, "Oh my goodness, I have lost a stalk, I'd better grow more stalks." And it does!

Governor Elect's Message
